## AGS strategy

Following the strategy workshop and subsequent consultations, the national committee has agreed a number of the options that members have put forward:

The AGS will positively position itself as part of the wider environmental movement, both publicly and internally. This dimension will be given equal or greater weight than positioning within the labour movement and left.

The AGS favours positive links with single issue groups including environmental groups.

We will seek to form a unified party with existing & new local parties and campaigns. There has been one meeting towards this and another is expected in October.

A national schedule of big events, at which we hope to have an AGS presence, will be drawn up and we will run stalls at these where feasible. Juliet Boddington will compile a schedule of events, so please let her have details of any you know about.

The AGS will explore and adopt a range of electronic campaigning methods and train people in these. Malcolm Christie and Celia Foote are organising a workshop in Leeds.

We will publicise to AGS members, much better than we do at present, what the AGS does, why we do it and how effective it is. This will cover activities including issue campaigns, meetings, publications and campaigning in elections.

Members will be encouraged to stand in local elections, subject to local resources.

We will be more selective in standing in general elections and focus on pre-agreed outcomes.

For one issue of the Green Socialist journal all members will be sent two copies and asked to find an outlet that will take the second copy, or sell it to someone themselves.

## WHY DO WE STAND IN ELECTIONS?

Firstly, by standing in elections we **raise the profile of the AGS**. Given that our biggest problem is “*who are you?*” it is a major opportunity. We get the chance to identify ourselves as a serious political group with a unique, broad and considered approach to the social, environmental and economic issues - at a time people are more open to thinking about politics. Our literature is widely distributed and so our name and politics reach a larger audience

Secondly, elections provide an opportunity to **gain members, supporters, and voters**. Standing in an election is a great opportunity to put our politics to people and to gain from them some level of commitment to the AGS, whether joining, doing a bit of work without joining, or just voting for the AGS.

Thirdly, standing in elections shows we are serious about our politics, Every candidate we stand **gives electors the genuine democratic choice** that is denied them by the nearly identical major parties. Any political organisation that fails to do this is really just playing at politics.

Fourthly, it gives us genuine **feedback from ordinary people**, both on the doorstep, via leaflet return slips and in terms of votes. Any group can talk to itself about politics. A group actually seeking change must be prepared to hear from real people.

Fifthly, standing and campaigning in elections gives a huge **boost to our local organisation**. Elections involve a layer of supporters who may otherwise do little or nothing. By and increasing their involvement it increases their commitment. It enables a local group to develop and exercise skills that can be applied not only to elections but to other campaigns.

Local elections require no deposit. Any candidature costs us only the effort and the money we choose to

spend on it - which can be significant or can be nothing. There really is no argument against standing as widely as possible in local elections. Parliamentary elections have a £500 deposit - which buys us some £15,000 worth of free delivery of the election address. Obviously in general elections we have to balance cost against outcomes.
